Homestay Rule for Student under 18

Daily Curfew

- ♦ Students must be home each night by Dinner Time; this would mean by 6:30pm-7:00pm each night.
- ❖ Students must not be given permission by homestay parents to stay out late unless it is a preorganized, age appropriate activity. e.g. movies, sports event, dinner at friends home, etc.
- ❖ In the case that a student does not come home for dinner or at a reasonable hour, please notify the homestay officer on 02 9262 2968.

Unexplained/Unexpected Absences or Lateness

❖ In the event that your student does not return home, does not make any contact with you and you are unable to contact him/her, please do not hesitate to contact our emergency service on 0421-484-130.

Overnight Absences

- Homestay Parents are not to give students permission to stay out overnight without notification from Australian Ideal College. Any overnight absences from homestay must be pre-organized and approved by Australian Ideal College. This also includes overnight/weekend stays with relatives.
- ♦ Australian Ideal College is responsible for all accommodation and welfare arrangements for all students under 18 whilst they are enrolled at our school.

Illness/Absence from School

- Any illness or sickness of a student, homestay must notify the school or homestay officer ASAP. You can do this by calling the school on 02 9262 2968 and speak to the student service officer or if easier/out of school hours, leave a clear message on 02 9262 2968.
- ❖ It is an important part of their Immigration Requirement that all absences be explained.
- ♦ Students will need a Doctors Certificate in the case of illness/sickness.
- Handwritten notes from Homestay families are not recognized by Immigration.
